

Workshop Title: Fast Piecing with Seminole Techniques

Description: Technique for making bands and quilting units

Level: Beginning and Intermediate or Advanced

Sewing Machine used: Yes

Students will be creating units that are made from long strips, and then sewn together, cut, and remade into a Seminole pattern. The strips will be suitable to be used in a small quilt, wall hanging, or garment. Please note: this class will focus on Seminole techniques, as opposed to Seminole piecing, and is suitable for experienced beginners, intermediate and advanced sewers.

A sewing machine and supplies are required.

Seminole piecing originated from the Seminole patchwork used in the clothing created by Seminole Indians

- Fabric in a variety of prints and solids (both contrasting and matching fabrics) in ¼ yard to ½ yard pieces
- ★ You will need at least four to five colors
- ★ Extension cord
- **≫** Iron
- ★ Basic sewing kit
- → Pens and pencils
- ★ Rotary cutter and board
- ★ Omnigrid or Quilter's ruler
- ★ Sense of adventure and Humor

Note: PRESHRINK YOUR FABRIC!

I am going to be doing a particular technique. Please bring some scrap fabric strips. It can be precut or pulled from your scarp bin. A variety of lengths and widths.
