

English Paper Piecing Design Party with Tina Craig

Learn the basics of English Paper Piecing, and complete a project that is uniquely yours. We'll be working with shapes based on equilateral triangles: hexagons, diamonds, jewels, and more. Learn about the geometry and supplies specific to EPP. Instruction will include basting, hand stitching, and fussy cutting. Improvisation and curved piecing will be discussed as time permits. Class handout includes instructions for finishing a 3-block table runner or 1-block mug mat. Suitable for beginners, this class will also engage experienced stitchers.

Supply List

- Fabric: assorted scraps, charm squares, fat eighths or fat quarters. Consider starting with a medium-scale print as a guide for choosing coordinating colors. Have about 6 coordinating fabrics handy.
- Fabric glue pen and refills, any brand
- Hand stitching needles- Straw or Milliner size 9 or 10
- Thin thread such as Superior Bottom Line (60 wt, 2 ply polyester)
- Separate scissors for paper and fabric
- Tape: paper first aid tape or masking tape, optional
- Colored pencils or crayons
- Thimble that works for you
