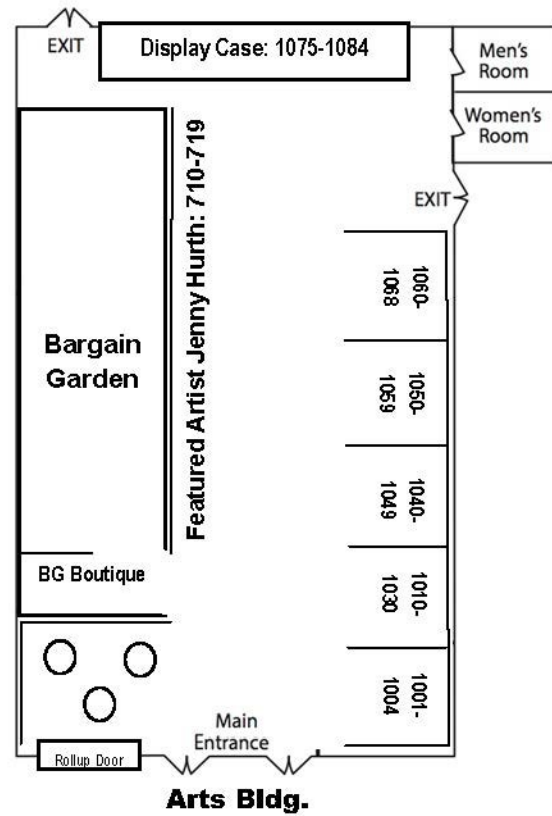


Quilt Show Policies

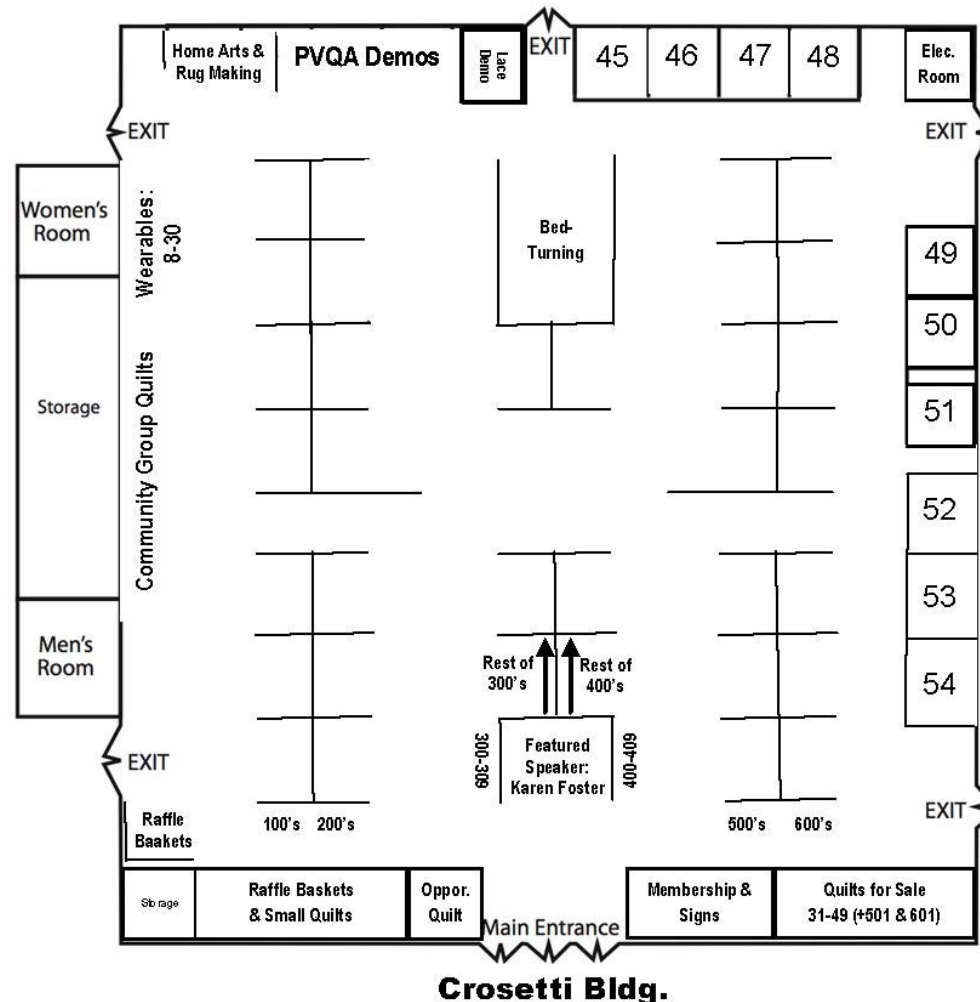
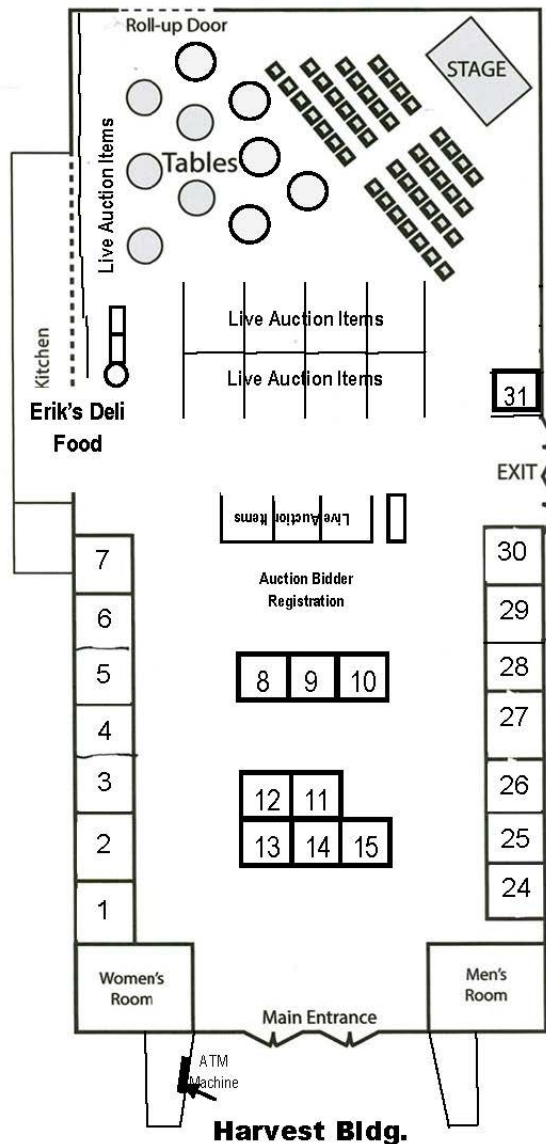

Jenny started making quilts as school fundraisers when her kids were little and got hooked. For decades she’s been working with salvaged materials. Since the beginning of the Covid-19 pandemic Jenny has picked up discarded surgical and cloth masks, surgical gloves, and disinfectant

wipes off the streets of Oakland and Berkeley. She launders them and makes “quilts” out of them. Jenny is a big fan of scavenging. There’s plenty of possibility in what gets tossed out.
