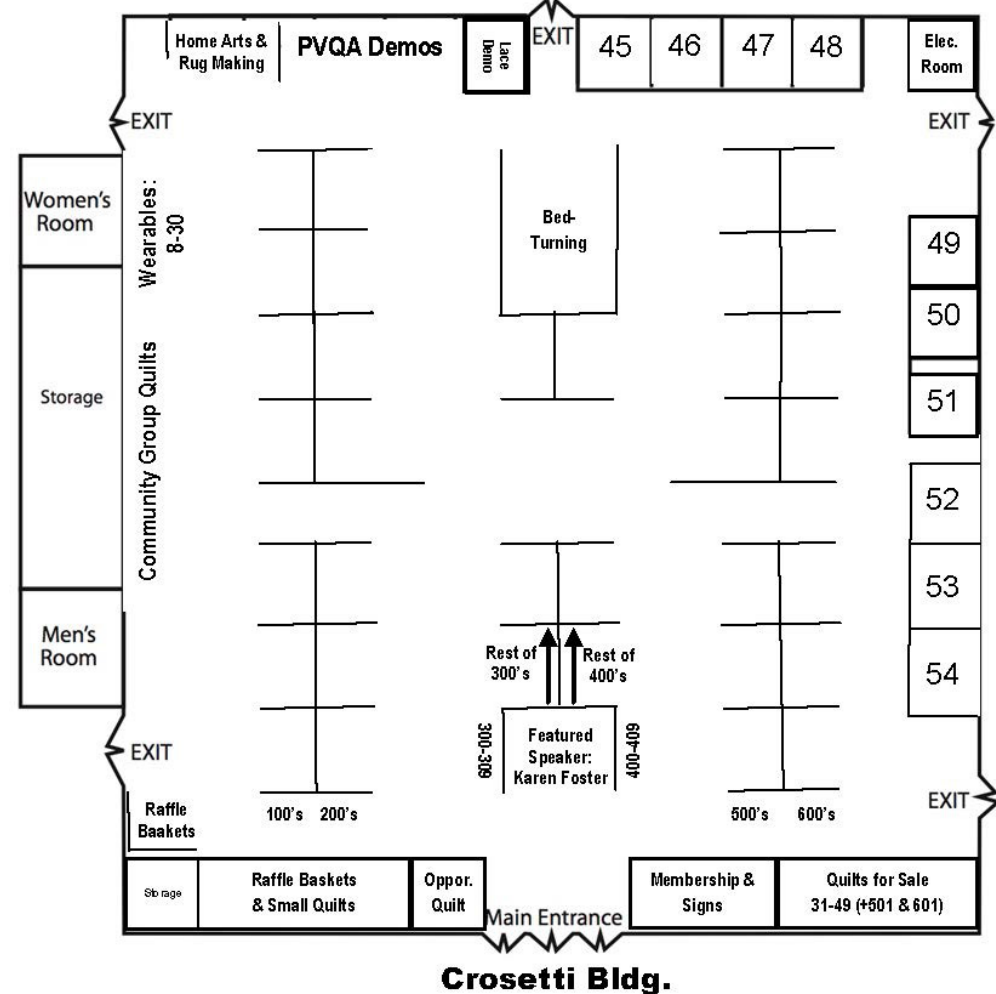
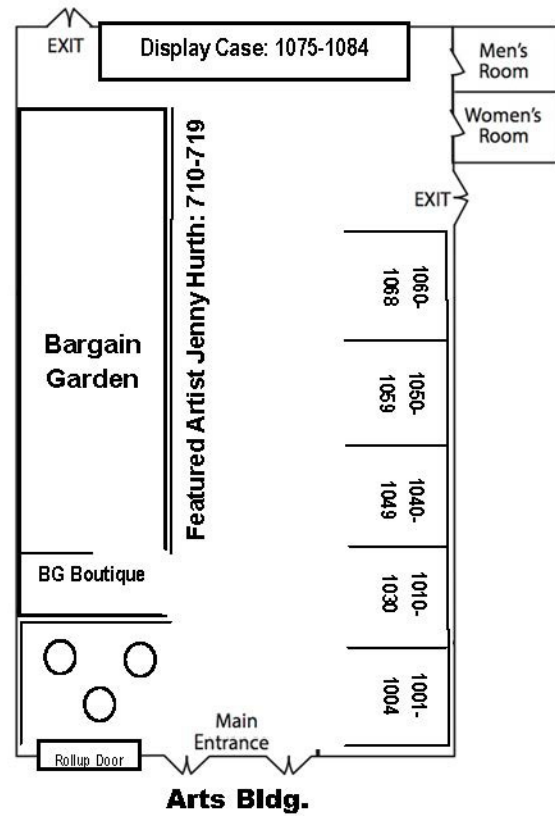
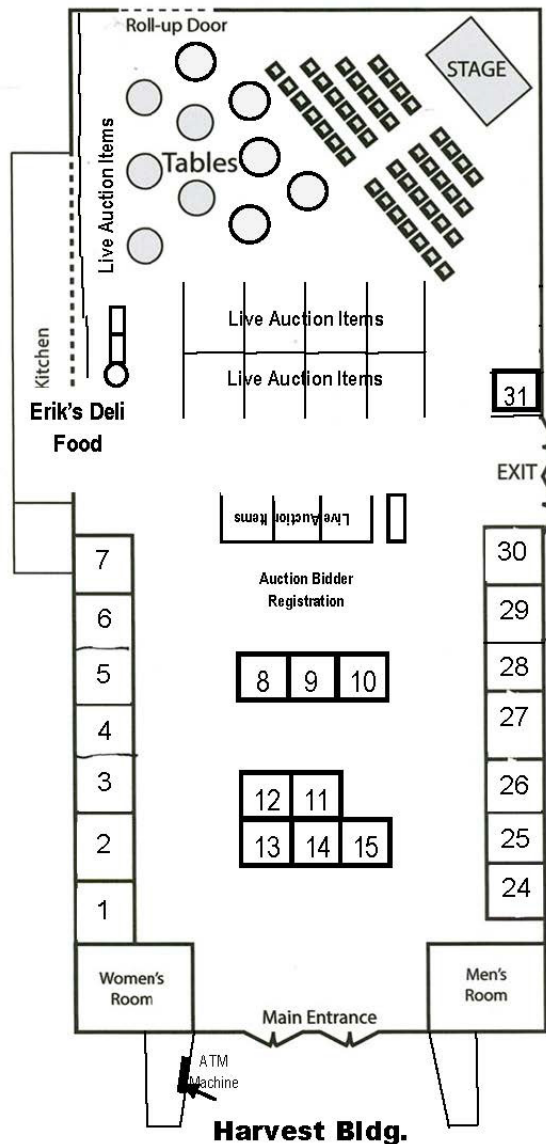


Quilt Show Policies

wipes off the streets of Oakland and Berkeley. She launders them and makes “quilts” out of them. Jenny is a big fan of scavenging. There’s plenty of possibility in what gets tossed out.
